

OTTAWA UNIVERSITY.

The following is a University commencement address of Very Rev. H. C. Weston, O.M., D.D., Rector of Ottawa University, was delivered at the fifty-first annual commencement exercises in the presence of the Governor-General upon whom the Senate of the University has conferred the degree of LL.D., and a brilliant assembly of guests.

Your Excellencies, Ladies and Gentlemen—It is my pleasing duty to appear before you in the name of the University of Ottawa. In order to extend to one and all here present, but in an especial manner to their Excellencies the Governor-General and the Councils of the Senate, our sincerest thanks for the encouragement of your kind attendance at these, our annual commencement exercises.

An occasion like this is one of annual recurrence within this old familiar walls. About the same time every year we welcome to our Assembly Hall, a large number of our friends and well-wishers, who come to witness the result of our studies as evidenced by the medals of honour that are awarded and by the graduation diplomas that are conferred upon the students who have completed their course of study.

The classical education which a young man receives is divided into two parts: the scientific and the artistic. The work of the first three years corresponds to that done in the high schools and colleges of the United States. At the end of the third year, the successful student receives a Bachelor of Arts degree, and as frequently happens to some students, at this stage, enters the study of law, medicine, or other liberal professions, so many of whom will become the mouth-pieces of public opinion, and the future legislators of our country.

A man, to be a complete man—not only should he be well versed in the study of letters, but he should be a model of exemplary Christian conduct, not only should his heart be formed by the practice of religion, but his mind should have gone through that process of liberal culture, that training, which only a Catholic education can give. It is essential that he should be prepared to be educated should opportunity offer, and that he should have a thorough knowledge of the different sciences and arts that come within the range of human intellect. An educated man should understand how disease is to be guarded against, and health preserved; consequently a knowledge of the history and principles of medicine is of great importance.
