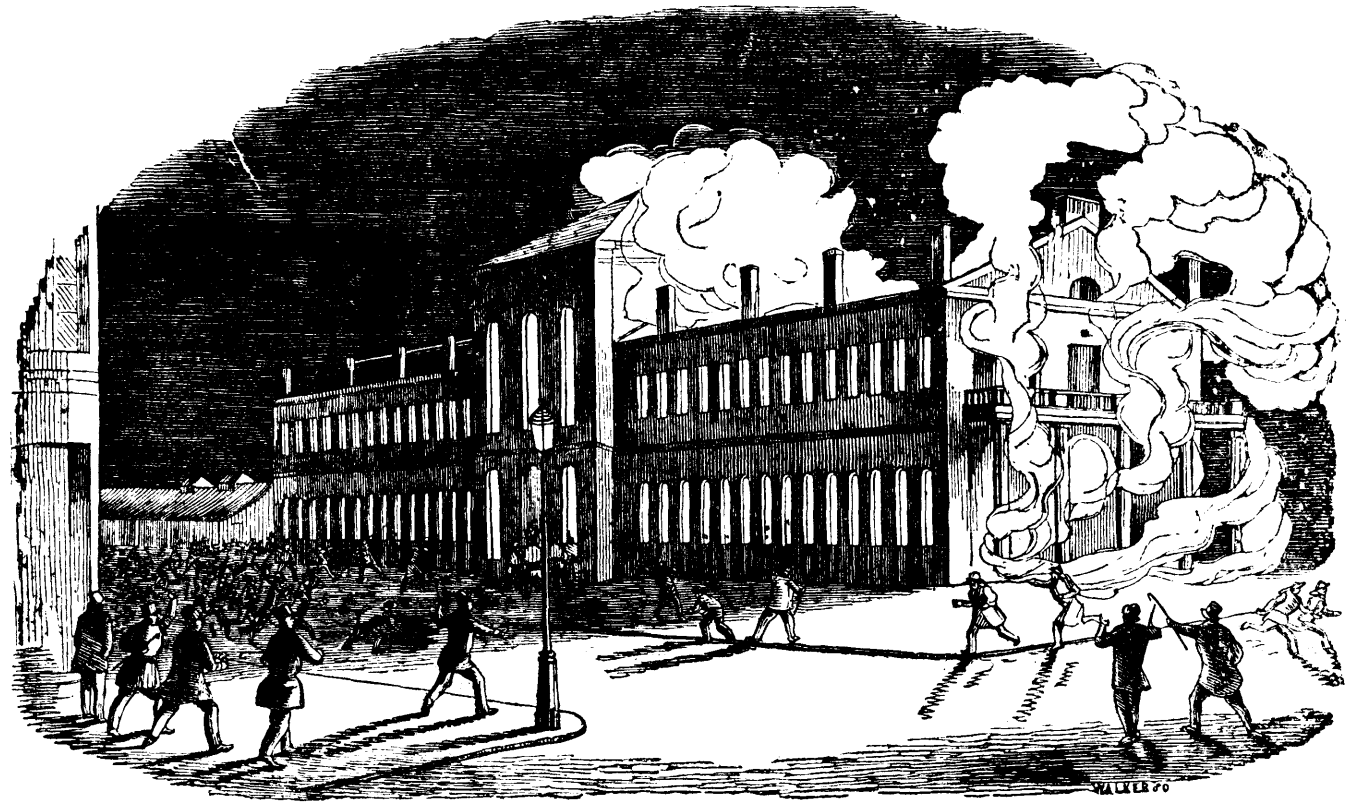
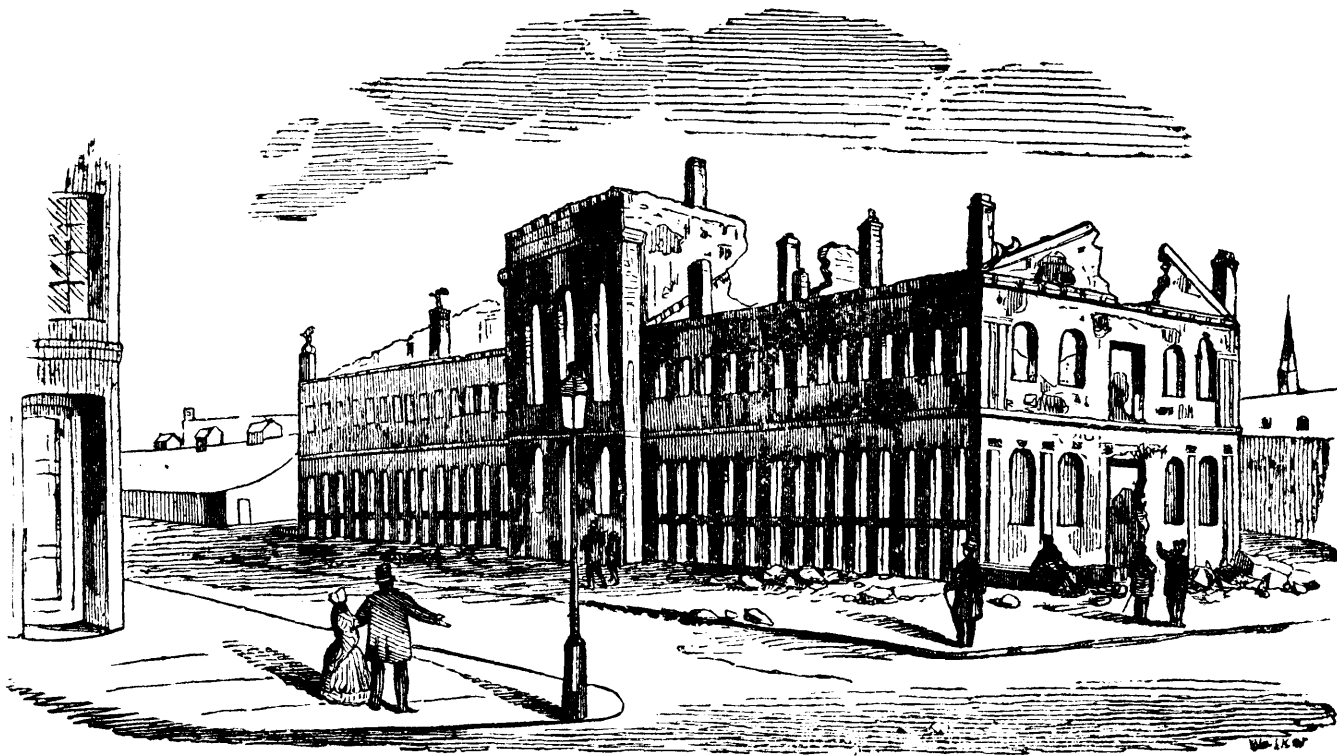


PUNCH IN CADA EXTRA.
