Beauregard. Outgoing families can obtain information (such as described in the last issue) and assistance in selecting children's schools and initiating registration procedures as well as identifying potential employers for a spouse and forwarding a spouse's résumé to the post. Returning families can pick up copies of Education Reports on Ottawa Hull, and spouses can consult Lise about employment possibilities.


