6.06 a. There are certain types of cases where the circumstances surrounding the applicant's national status require more than ordinary investigation or where circumstances of residence combined with national status raise considerations that call for careful study. In addition, there are instances where persons would have their citizenship revoked or would be considered to have lost it if the full facts were known to the authorities in Ottawa.

b. Offices abroad should not without prior approval of the Department decide upon the national status of persons in the following categories:

1. Persons granted Certificates of Citizenship and persons who were British subjects with Canadian domicile on December 31st, 1946, who have been resident outside of Canada for six years and whose citizenship has not been extended under Section 20 of the Canadian Citizenship Act; (see 6.12[?]a.)

2. Persons granted Certificates of Naturalization and who have been resident outside of Canada for six years, which may include a period prior to January 1st, 1947 and
