

Persons convicted of an offence under these regulations face fines of up to \$25,000 and/or imprisonment for up to five years.

Exceptions to the regulations may be made for certain conservation or compassionate reasons, as for example, legally acquired hunting trophies, ivory acquired by culling herds from range states with CITES-approved conservation programs, items for museum exhibits and educational or research purposes, and death bequests.
