but he wrecked it right at the finish. The hon. member for Calgary West (Mr. Smith) could you see the scenery of the Rocky mountains. I contend that is a statement nobody but a blind man would make. I want to deal with the arguments made by both these members. I do not think it is right to allow them to stand, when they are without foundation, without at least explaining them to some extent.

On motion of Mr. Fair the debate was adjourned.
