A back of thin metal is pressed on the book, with flunges overlapping the ends of the pins, which prevents the leaves from tearing from the pins, as is the case with wire, sewing or tape work.

By a peculiar curve in the pins, perfect flexibility is secured in the opening of the volume, the whole ferming a practical and substantial binding, absolutely indestructible by ordinary wear and tear.
