Significant State Circular for French-Canadian Readers

Special Effort Being Made to Swell the Population of French Origin in the Census Returns—Why Keep Up This Interminable Race Distinction?

Ottawa, April 8.—(Special)—The appointment of a second assistant to the Chief Census Commissioner was announced in the Liberal press in Quebec, as indicating that a special effort would be made to swell the French-Canadian population of the Dominion.

Why This Distinction? That every legitimate effort should be made to bring up the population of French-Canadian origin minutely enumerated is not blameworthy policy, nor one that should excite surprise, under existing conditions.
