The dispute was one complicated and difficult, both sides making very conflicting claims. It had to be settled some time, and could only be settled finally by diplomacy or arbitration or adjudication or war. This adjudication should have settled the matter, for it is final, unless we wish to repudiate it and adopt the only other alternative—war. Does any man in Canada wish to go into a costly and dangerous war on account of a dispute which the Chief Justice of England has decided against us? I do not believe there is one. It is for this reason I regret that two of our representatives have protested to the protest, unless they advocate in the protest, unless they advocate the legitimate and logical result of such action, viz., war by Canada alone.
