Ottawa, July 14.-(Special.)-Four amendments to the railway act presented to the house to-day by W. F. Maclean were formally declared "Lost on Division" after a solid discussion extending over several hours. These amendments were considered in connection with Mr. Fitzpatrick's bill to amend the railway act. At the suggestion of the minister of

the bill will be moved on Tuesday next, when the house will be divided on each of the four amendments, which were voted down to-day. Briefly stated the amendments were as follows:

1. To bring express companies under the jurisdiction of the railway com-
