PREMIER HEARST OPENS NURSES' HOME AT BYRON

Tributes Paid to the Work
Being Done at the
Sanatorium.

NEED IS VERY GREAT

Vocational Training Building
Formally Opened by Sir
James Loughheed.

The clouds which threatened rain all Wednesday morning broke shortly after noon, and the sun shone forth as if in benediction upon the opening ceremonies in connection with the nurses' residence, the gift of Sir Adam and Lady Beck, and the new vocational training and recreation building in connection with the Byron Sanatorium.

Immediately after the formal opening of the new utilities building on Dundas street, Sir William Hearst, premier of Ontario, and Sir James Loughheed, head of the Invalid Soldiers' Commission, motored with Sir Adam and Lady Beck to the sanatorium to officiate at the function.

Not only was there a large attendance of citizens, but the county was well represented, a number of municipal officers being present.

City of Healing. While the sanatorium has developed apace, from the administration building and a few cottages of less than nine years ago, to a veritable city of healing, Sir James Loughheed indicated that so far as the tuberculosis soldiers are concerned, the end of building activities has not yet been reached. A new soldiers' pavilion will be erected shortly with accommodation for 50 patients, at a cost of about \$250,000, making a capacity sufficient to care for 250 patients in the section in charge of Invalid Soldiers' Commission. He further brought the news that the erection will be proceeded with at once of the military convalescent home in London, for which the site has already been secured and which will cost about \$400,000.

Assuring Sir James Loughheed of the continued co-operation of the London Health Association with the Invalid Soldiers' Commission in looking after the welfare of tuberculous soldiers, Sir Adam suggested that the Government might erect for the sanatorium a pavilion with accommodation for six officers and also a garage to house the new motor ambulance necessitated by the increased use of the building.

Can Not Rest. Sir James Loughheed jokingly remarked that he understood that Sir Adam could not rest unless he was promoting activities which would mean important opening ceremonies of public buildings at least once in four weeks. It is evident from the remarks of the head of the Invalid Soldiers' Commission that more will be doing at the Byron Sanatorium in the near future in the way of formal openings.

The first event which marked the visit to the sanatorium was the opening by Sir William and Lady Hearst of the home and inviting nurses' residence, a gift of thanksgiving from the part of Sir Adam and Lady Beck for the recovery from serious illness which threatened their only daughter, Marion Aura. A touching incident occurred in connection with the presentation of the building, which was accepted on behalf of the London Health Association by the vice-president, Major Gordon Ingram. Starting to read the address of presentation, Sir Adam was overcome with emotion and unable to proceed. Taking the paper from his hand, Lady Beck continued where he left off, but her voice, too, broke over the words. Standing beside her grandmother, Mrs. P. D. Cregar of Hamilton, was the winsome young girl, in gratitude for the recovery of the gift of love has been made.

Accepts the Gift. Major Ingram expressed the wish of the Health Association that the building be called the Marion Beck Nurses' Residence.

The address of welcome to the distinguished visitors was given by Judge Judd, honorary treasurer of the London Health Association, who, asking Sir William Hearst to unlock the door of the residence, also called upon him for an address. Responding, the premier paid an eloquent tribute to the nursing profession and the heroism of the nurse, not only as revealed in the war, but fighting her battles for life with resourcefulness and heroism under many difficult circumstances.

"Only those who have stood on the borderland and looked into the great beyond," he said, "can understand how trying and exacting is the life of the nurse, and understand what the services of the nurse mean. I doubt if we can get more heroic examples of devotion to duty than in the nursing profession."

Will Mean Much. Under the circumstances, he stated, it afforded him much happiness to have the honor of formally opening the beautiful building, enhanced by the conditions surrounding the gift, which is destined to mean so much in the way of comfort and pleasure for the nurses serving at the sanatorium. Commending the generosity and good citizenship of Sir Adam and Lady Beck, which have been expressed in such valuable service to the community, province and empire, especially since the outbreak of war, the speaker expressed the wish that their daughter, in whose name the building has been erected and equipped, may long be spared to follow the example of her parents in good citizenship.

He assured the London Health Association that as trustees of the people, the Ontario Government will help as far as possible in the work of healing and love represented by the sanatorium. The building was formally dedicated by Rev. Canon Tucker, rector of St. Paul's Cathedral, and after the conclusion of the formalities of opening, the public was given an opportunity to see for itself the beautiful interior. Bright and cheery and furnished with exquisite taste, the window seat around the oriole window on the platform half-way up the stairway, and commanding a magnificent view of the river and fields, hills and woods beyond, was one of the features especially admired. Another was the spacious living-room, with its chintz upholstered wicker chairs and couches to coax weary bodies to rest; its fireplace, writing desks, piano, books and restful color scheme dominated by rose, the crowning act of thoughtfulness on the part of Lady Beck was the placing on the tables of the latest and most readable books, and here and there vases of fragrant flowers.

Vocational Building. From the nurses' home the crowds of patients made their way to the new recreation and vocational building right on the river bank, where several of the soldier patients had already assembled. The ceremony of declaring the building open here took place in the large recreation hall, Sir Adam Beck, president of the London Health Association, presiding. Among those who were seated on the platform with the guests of honor of the day were Brig.-Gen. Shannon and Lieut.-Col. H. G. Smith, representing No. 1 Military District headquarters; Lady Beck and her mother, Mrs. Cregar; Major Gordon Ingram, F.R.C.S., M.P., Lieut.-Col. W. M. Gartshore, chairman of the hospital trust; Mrs. C. R. Somerville, president of the Canadian War Contingent Association, and wife of the mayor of London; William Graham of the county of Middlesex, ex-Warden A. Blaikie, J. W. Laidlaw, representing the county on the hospital commission; Major Ingram, Judge Judd and other members of the London Health Association, and Dr. Kibbe, the recently appointed medical supervisor of the sanatorium.

Needs Are Great. The department is charged with looking after the "after-

math of the war and the tragedies war leaves behind." Sir James Loughheed referred to the great need discovered by the war for provision to care for the men developing tuberculosis in military service. The Military Hospitals Commission has been given great impetus to the organization of work for the care of the tuberculous, though it was at first difficult to get the people to understand the need of establishing special institutions. For the Queen Alexandra Sanatorium and the London Health Association and its supporters, Sir James has given the praise: "In no institution in Canada have we met the same satisfaction as in the institution which we are visiting today. No institution of the kind is comparable to the Queen Alexandra Sanatorium in building, organization, equipment and administration."

"It has no peer in Canada, and in saying so I am not deprecating the splendid work being done by other institutions in Canada," he said. Turning to the subject of vocational training, Sir James Loughheed emphasized the importance of preparing the returned men for reinstatement in civil life, many of whom become incapacitated through injuries received for their former occupation.

At the close of the address of the head of the Invalid Soldiers' Commission, Sir Adam Beck, president of the London Health Association, on behalf of the nurses' residence, the gift of Sir Adam and Lady Beck, and the new vocational training and recreation building in connection with the Byron Sanatorium.
