To Co-operate for Better Relations Between Employer and Employee.

GREETINGS TO CONGRESS

Laymen May Administer Private Baptism in Cases of Emergency.

TORONTO, Sept. 19.—Practically the whole of the sessions of the Anglican General Synod today were taken up with the revision of the prayer book. Among the more important subjects dealt with were the holy communion and public and private baptism of infants. A number of minor changes were also effected in the estimation and the order for the visitation of the sick. Collects, epistles and gospel readings in the liturgy of the Scottish Church, in the marriage and burial services were inserted at the end of the services of the Book of Common Prayer. With the exception of one prayer the form of service for use of days of national thanksgiving was adopted.

The appointment of a war service commission to deal with all matters affecting returned soldiers was made and a resolution of greetings sent to the Trades and Labor Congress now in session in Quebec.

The Lower House early today adopted a motion to the effect that a committee be formed to look after the question of co-operation with labor for betterment of conditions between employers and employees.

The following will form the committee: Principal W. H. Vance, Vancouver; Canon Plumtree, Toronto; Chief Justice Mathers, Winnipeg; Lansing Lewis, Montreal.

A call for the co-operation of all laymen in the work to be undertaken for the welfare of returned soldiers was made by Dean Starr, Kingston. Such a society as the Brotherhood of St. Andrew could play a valuable and inspiring part in the social service end of church life. He recommended the use of parish halls as social centres for returned men.

Laymen May Baptize. The necessity of further instruction, regarding the ministrations of private baptism by laymen in cases of necessity where no clergyman can be found, was brought up by the bishop of Huron at the afternoon session, when the revision of the prayer book was continued.

A rubric recommended by the revision committee, directing laymen to baptize in such cases, was moved by Bishop Williams and adopted.

For the benefit of those who desire to communicate after marriage, a motion was adopted to insert at the end of the form for the solemnization of matrimony the collect, epistle and gospel used for this purpose in the Scottish liturgy.

Another resolution was adopted by which the collect, epistle and gospel used in the Scottish church at the burial of the dead will be inserted in the book of service of the book of common prayer.

Greetings to Labor Congress. After a short discussion the synod adopted a resolution of greetings to the members of the Trades and Labor Congress now in session at Quebec. The resolution embodied recognition of the splendid contribution organized labor has made to the war effort, and the efforts of the war, both by generous enlistment for overseas service, and by the efforts of labor in munition work and industrial life generally.

The synod desired to assure the congress of the church's deep sympathy with all who seek to improve the social and economic conditions in the Dominion. The synod felt that this task was one that concerned the church equally with organized labor.

The message closed with the hope that co-operation might be closer and more cordial.

The primate announced that Bishop Gore of Oxford, who was invited to attend the synod, was unable to come. The appointment of the following members of the synod to the war service commission was adopted: Bishop Ridwell, Ontario; Bishop Roper, Ottawa; Bishop Fairbridge, Montreal; Rev. Dean Starr, Kingston; Rev. G. S. Kuhring, St. John; N. B. Mr. Justice Hodgins, and R. W. Allin, Toronto.

A form of service for Dominion Day and other occasions of national thanksgiving, with the exception of the collect for the Empire, was adopted.
