

The executive of the dockers' union met today, and passed a resolution demanding reinstatement of the dismissed policemen, failing which they will give whole-hearted support to the police.

Another meeting of trade union organizations of all trades was convened at Liverpool tonight to consider the advisability of calling a general strike in support of the police union and to
