### 100 CARS AT CITY YARDS TRADE BRISK, PRICES FIRM

Sheep, Lambs, Calves Continue Steady—Hogs Sell Higher, Reaching \$6.75 Cwt.

The railroads reported receipts of 100 car loads of live stock for Wednesday and Thursday, consisting of 1712 cattle, 1631 hogs, 238 sheep and lambs, with 124 calves.

Trade in butchers' cattle was good, with prices a little higher in the medium class, but the market for exporters was not any better than at the commencement of the week, in fact, it was not quite as good, that is when quality is considered.

Steady prices again paid for milkers and springers to-day. Messrs. Tariff of Quebec and N. Dezil of Montreal being on the market made prices stronger, they otherwise would have been.

Receipts have been light all week, with market strong. Export ewes, \$4 to \$4.50; rams, \$3.25 to \$3.75; lambs, \$5.50 to \$6 per cwt. for common and choice grain fed at \$6.50 to \$7 per cwt.

Mr. Harris quotes selects, \$6.75, fed and watered, and \$6.50, 5.0 lbs; cans, country points; sows, \$4 to \$5 per cwt.; stags, \$2 to \$3 per cwt., as to quality.

Of course they were bought at the time when all things pointed to higher prices, but there was one load weighing 1440 lbs. that would be hard to beat on any market, and they did not make any money for the drover or dealers handling them, having been bought at too high a price from the farmer. Export steers sold at \$5.30 to \$5.40, with the best load seen on the market this season, at \$5.50. The latter price is no criterion to go by, as there are few like them in the country. Export bulls sold at \$4 to \$4.50 with now and again one at \$4.75 to \$5 per cwt.

Prime picked lots sold at \$4.85 to \$5.15, loads of good, \$4.50 to \$4.75; medium, \$4 to \$4.40; common, \$3.50 to \$4; cows, \$3 to \$4.25; canners and common cows, \$1.50 to \$2.50; butchers' bulls, \$2 to \$4.

H. & W. Murby report very light receipts of feeders and stockers. During the week the Messrs. Murby handled about 150 cattle at the following quotations: Best feeders, 900 to 1000 lbs. each, at \$2.75 to \$4.25 per cwt.; medium, same weights, \$2.90 to \$4; stockers, 500 to 700 lbs., at \$2.75 to \$3.
