BISLEY SHOTS HONORED BY THEIR COMRADES
Reception Tendered by 13th Regt. Presentation to Cobalt's New Fire Chief.

HAMILTON, Sept. 10.—(Special.)—A complimentary reception was tendered at the armories to-night to the three members of the 13th Regiment who were on the Bisley team, Serjt.-Major Higgins, Staff-Serjt. Mitchell and Corporal-Serjt. Freeborn. The reception was given by the regiment and there were also 1500 people present. Each of the men was presented with a gold pocket watch by Lieut.-Col. E. E. W. Moore and speeches were made by Lieut.-Col. Bertram, commander of the Bisley team; Lieut.-Col. A. E. Moore and Mayor McLaren. The officers of the other corps were also present. Serjt.-Major Higgins made a suitable reply on behalf of the team men. A telegram was received from ten officers of the Montreal Regiment extending their congratulations.

The three men to-night bade farewell to Lieut. Kappelle, who has been appointed chief of the Cobalt department. Chief TenEyck presented him with a gold watch and for on behalf of the officers and firemen and Second Assistant Chief Atchison gave him a pocket and chain on behalf of the Hamilton Firemen's Benevolent Association. Mayor McLaren and a number of the older men were present. Mr. Kappelle left for Cobalt to-night.

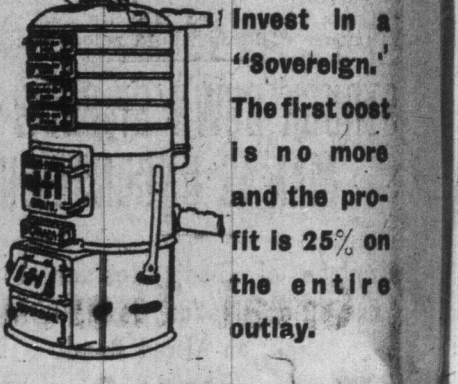
