LOCAL NEWS

The Majestic brought down a fairly large cargo of freight yesterday afternoon. Included in the cargo were 240 crates of new potatoes. They sold at \$1.50 a bushel, which is twenty-five cents less than what they sold for last week. The price compares very favorably with last year's price at this time of the year.

Abel Humphrey, an employee of R. P. and W. F. Starr, was painfully hurt yesterday afternoon while at his work

around the coal pocket in North Wharf. A door fell about twenty feet and struck Mr. Humphrey on the back of the right shoulder. He was taken to his home in Metcalfe street.

A. C. Skelton, president of the Local Council of Boy Scouts, received a communication from H. W. Hubbard, of the Experimental Farms, Fredericton Junction, yesterday, requesting that some hundred boy scouts be sent out to the farms, for the purpose of going over about ten acres of turnip patch. This work, ranking as war service, will be the means of the Scouts qualifying for war service badges.

More than 100 sailors of the steamer Kristianfjord, which was wrecked about two weeks ago off the Newfoundland coast, arrived in the city yesterday morning from North Sydney. They were taken from St. John's (Nfld.) to North Sydney and from there they were brought to the city on the C. G. R. via Moncton, arriving here yesterday morning at about 7 o'clock. They were to leave for New York last night by the Boston train, but were held up by the U. S. immigration officials, and will leave as soon as possible. They will go from New York to Norway on the Bergensfjord, a sister ship of the wrecked Kristianfjord.
