EXTERMINATING THE ARMENIANS
Minister of War Boasts of Their Destruction
HAS DONE MORE THAN ABUL

Systematic Outrages Carried Out by Soldiers—Strengthens Resolution to Rid Europe of The Turks

It is said that Enver Bey the Young Turk Minister of War, and the chief of the pro-Germans in Constantinople, is boasting that he did to the Armenians in thirty days what Abdul Hamid failed to do in all his years of cruelty and tyranny—destroyed them as a nation. Whether Enver means the best or not, he might as well have made it, for he would have spoken nothing but the plain truth. The case of Constantine, the former Sultan, "Abdul the Damned," was spasmodically set in his scheme of exterminating the Armenians, but Enver Bey, Talat Bey, and his colleagues have succeeded so well that Armenia is almost unrecognizable by Armenians now.

The hideous stories of the massacres by Turkish soldiers under military orders are coming to light, and the indignation of the Christian world has burst into a flame of hatred against the Sultan. The resolution of the Allies that the Turk must be hounded "bag and baggage" out of Europe will be strengthened by the Armenian atrocities, for the Turk is a kind of the Teuton fever, and as such deserves no consideration.
