Montreal, April 12—The report of the International Paper Co. for 1921, made public yesterday, showed a loss of \$1,166,289 after charges, compared with a profit of \$115,826 the year before. Total revenues declined from \$21,239,065 to \$18,542,642. The heavy losses resulted from the closing of the company's plants for several months during the year, due to labor troubles, and the general business depression.

KALL IN RETAIL FOOD PRICES

Average in March in New York is 3 Per Cent. Lower Than February's.

Although the retail food prices in New York City for the average family decreased 3 per cent in March, compared with February, as shown by figures made public in Washington yesterday by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the Department of Labor, they are still 42 per cent. higher than in 1913. The decrease for the year period, March 15, 1921, to March 15, 1922, was 9 per cent. in this city.
