

NO GRAIN YET IN ELEVATORS AT THIS PORT

There is no grain in either of the local elevators, although a small quantity is expected to arrive over the C. P. R. by the first of next week. Local shipping people and others are somewhat at a loss to understand reports recently published to the effect that large shipments of grain are being routed over the Grand Trunk and shipped from Portland, Maine, while the present conditions prevail here.
