#### PLANNING FOR EXPORT

TRADE FROM CANADA.

The Canadian trade commissioner at Washington, in acknowledging a copy of the St. John Board of Trade report for 1919, states his belief that if the citizens of the industrial centres and the large ocean ports would take a vital interest in the matter of export trade they could exert a very beneficial influence on the foreign commerce of the Dominion. Continuing, he says: "Canada has it in her power, beyond all doubt, enormously to increase her exports, if she will only give close attention to the principles by which success in such a trade is obtained. We can make the goods as well as any country in the world, but where we so often fail is in the marketing of them abroad. It seems to me that we should be making plans for the time when business depression which has followed every great war will be severely felt."
