Valparaiso, Chile, Feb. 8—It is announced that the government has instructed the naval authorities here to investigate a proposal made by Lord Cochrane's syndicate for the formation of an Anglo-Chilean steam navigation company that shall turn over to the government a fleet of twelve new steamers of modern construction of 10,000 tons each, and with a speed of ten miles an hour, for service
