a girl settled in the situation to which she first went. They never grow contented or happy for two or three months. As a rule, with two or three exceptions, I have had no reason to complain of the character of the girls sent out. Half the girls were sent out by the Hon. Mrs. Joyce, and her girls on the whole have been very satisfactory, though some have been rather inefficient. I have also received five little girls of about twelve from England. These little girls are under Government control until they attain their seventeenth birthday, and I send reports about them to the Minister of the Interior. They give me a good deal of trouble, but in the end I have always succeeded in finding good homes for them. The little orphan children who come up to me from Ontario, I am in no way responsible for, except during the night that they are with me.

This Home has not been much used by city girls, but girls coming in here from the country use it to a large extent. After all, the Home is primarily intended for strangers coming to the city, and its main objects would be much better served if we were in a building of our own close to the depot.

## 2. I now speak of the internal arrangement of the Home.

In this context I must speak of the kindness I have received from the President and from my matrons. It is a well known fact that Mrs. Parker is a very busy woman, but for all that I have always found her ever ready to give me advice and assistance whenever I have gone to her in any
