

1849 Destruction & Mob Law in Canada

April 25 The Governor General of Canada entered the
parliament House and gave the Royal Assent to
the Bill for authorising the payment of Indemnity
for losses sustained by the late Rebellion. The
Assembly being then in Session. When the Governor
was attacked by a Mob on leaving the House and
was retired for safety to his Country Seat. —
The Mob destroyed the Interior of the Parliament
House and the House Library and set the Building
on Fire — The Mob burned down LaFontaine
House, Martial Law was about to be proclaimed.
The English Royalists Petitioned the Home Govern-
ment for the removal of Lord Elgin from the Govern-
