Under the provisions of "The Stamp Acts, 1898-1914," the following Rules and Regulations respecting Stamp Duties, in substitution for those of date September 15th, 1914, have been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

Proclamation

By His Excellency Sir Walter Edward Davidson, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Newfoundland and its Dependencies. Whereas it is provided by Chapter 23, of 2 Edward VII, entitled "An Act to amend the Post Office Act, 1891," that upon the recommendation of the Board appointed under the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, by Proclamation, give notice of any alteration of name, naming or renaming of places within the Colony, provided that Public Notice of such proposed alteration of name, naming, or renaming of places shall have been given for three months previous; And whereas by Public Notice of date the 16th day of June, 1914, certain alterations of name and renaming of places within the Colony were notified, as required by the above mentioned Act;
