

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto His said Majesty THE KING, his Heirs and Successors forever, in trust to sell the same to such person or persons, and upon such terms as the Government of the Dominion of Canada may deem most conducive to our welfare and that of our people.

AND upon the further condition that all moneys received from the sale thereof, shall, after deducting the usual proportion for expenses of management, be and the cash payment hereinafter provided for, be placed to our credit and interest thereon paid us, in the usual way.

AND WE, the said Chief and Principal men of the said

The Thunderchild Band of Indians do on behalf of our people and for ourselves hereby ratify and confirm, and promise to ratify and confirm, whatever the said Government may do, or cause to be lawfully done, in connection with the sale of the said lands and the disposition of the moneys arising therefrom.

This Surrender is granted on the following conditions, namely:-

1. That this reserve be sold at an upset price of not less than Six dollars per acre.
2. That we be given at Bright Sand Lake the same number of acres, including the timber thereon, as we have in our present Reserve, for which we are willing to pay Three dollars per acre.
3. That the difference in value between this amount (\$3.00) and the actual amount realized from the sale of our present Reserve, be given to us in the following manner.
4. That the Department will pay to the Thunderchild Band of Indians at the time of surrender \$15,000.00, cash.
5. That we receive fishing privileges on some Lake we may choose in the neighbourhood of our new Reserve, and that we be given ammunition and twine for nets.
6. That all money, minus fifteen thousand dollars realized from the sale of our present Reserve, be funded for our use and benefit, and that the money be given to us once in three months.
7. That the Indians shall have a voice in the expenditure of the interest on the funded money.
8. That we be given, free, an engine, saw-mill, planer and shingle mill for the use of all Indians in this agency, who may in future surrender their reserves and congregate somewhere near us, or with us.
9. That we receive a timber limit where we can procure lumber for our own use, either for building, or for the purpose of sale.
