The trades dispute bill provides that no act of a trades union shall be held to be unlawful if such act is lawful when committed by an individual. It sets forth in express terms the right of strikers and defines the law of agency as applied to trades unions, making it impossible to claim redress from union funds for any act unless it is clear that the act was authorized by the governing body of the union.
