Again Cobb was the person against whom the feeling was evident, when at the close of the game he was surrounded by a bleacher crowd. They pushed the Detroit player and he shouldered them back while he answered their ribes. Wads of paper were thrown. Police officers had difficulty in reaching Cobb's side, but eventually they forced a clear space, and, assisted by Detroit and Boston players, escorted him to the clubhouse. The demonstration against Cobb manifested itself every time he appeared at the plate, the crowd "booming" him each time.
