PRAYERS.

The HOUSE in Committee (Mr. Jarvis in the Chair) went into the consideration of "A Bill in addition to an Act, intituled an Act for the better "ascertaining and confirming the boundaries of the several Counties within "this Province, and for subdividing them into Towns and Parishes." The Speaker having resumed the Chair, the Chairman Reported that the Committee had agreed to the same under the title of "A Bill for creeting the "Eastern part of the County of Westmorland into a distinct Town or Parish," which Report is accepted, and it is ORDERED, That the Bill be Engrossed.

On the second Reading of "A Bill for regulating Highways and so forth." ORDERED, That it be Committed.

The HOUSE in Committee (Mr. M'Kay in the Chair) went into the consideration of "A Bill for granting aid in support of the College of New-" Brunswick, incorporated by Charter, and established at Fredericton." The Speaker having resumed the Chair, the Chairman Reported that the Committee had agreed to the same; which Report is accepted by the House, and it is ORDERED, That the Bill be Engrossed.

READ the third time as Engrossed "A Bill to continue an Act for raising "a Revenue in this Province." ORDERED, That this Bill pass and be sent up to the Council for their concurrence.

The HOUSE in Committee (Mr. R. Pagan in the Chair) went into the consideration of "A Bill to continue and amend an Act made and passed in the "Thirty-Sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled an Act for regulat-"ing, laying out, and repairing Highways and Roads, and for appointing Commissioners and Surveyors of Highways within the several Towns or "Parishes in this Province and for suspending for a limited time all the "Laws now in force relating to the same." The Speaker having resumed the Chair, the Chairman Reported that on the Question whether this Bill be adopted? The Committee had divided, and it was carried in the Negative, and that the Question was then put whether the Act now in force, regulating Highways and so forth, be continued four Years longer, which was likewise carried in the Negative—The Report is accepted. ORDERED, That the Bill be recommitted—The House accordingly again went into Committee (Mr. W. Pagan in the Chair) on the further consideration of the The Speaker having resumed the Chair, the Chairman then Reported that the Committee had agreed to the Bill under the title of "A "Bill to continue an Act made and passed in the Thirty-Sixth Year of His " Majesty's Reign, intituled an Act for regulating, laying out, and repair-"ing Highways and Roads, and for appointing Commissioners and Surveyors " of Highways within the several Towns or Parishes in this Province, and " for suspending for a limited time all the Laws now in force relating to the "same," which Report is accepted. The Question was then put whether the House agree to the Report, whereupon the House divided as followeth, to wit:
