THE DEATH OF MR. ARTHUR MORINE.

The cloud of sorrow has hung heavily over Church St. during the last three or four months. But it has not swamped any other household so heavily as it has that of the late Mr. Arthur Morine. Three months ago all its members, save Mrs. Morine, were in their usual good health. Today the father, the mother, and the only son, Robie, are silent in death. And only three sorrow-stricken young ones are left. To whom the deep sympathy of the whole community goes out.

Three weeks ago when it was known that Mr. Morine was sick a throb of regret sprang up in every heart.

Those who knew him best knew how deeply he had felt the death of his wife. And also that of his eldest son with whom he had worked and planned for all the last earlier years. And when it was known ten days ago that his sickness was unto death, a deep regret filled every heart. So that on Monday last when the people were called together to pay their last respects a large and representative gathering showed their sympathy and regard. The funeral was conducted by the family pastor. Rev. Mr. Friggins, assisted by Rev. Dr. Borden of Kentville and the Rev. S. J. Woodroffe, Rector of St. John's Church. The singing, the reading of the scripture, the prayers, and the few, but earnest words of the Rev. Mr. Friggins, were most impressive. And there were many tearful eyes as the body was moved from the house by six life-boy friends and neighbors to be taken for interment to the Methodist cemetery.

As the writer returned from the funeral with another life-long friend he remarked—"a kinder and truer friend" than Arthur Morine never was. He "never failed once."

Such was the character of the deceased gentleman. Quiet and unassuming but deep and tender in his feelings, no one ever looked to him in vain for a kindly and helpful act. He was a most devoted father, never thinking of himself, but in a great usefulness doing his best for his wife and children, it was good always to watch him about his work. Not aggressive in thought, or action, his neighbors yet appreciated him sufficiently to elect him a member of the School Board and wherever a kind thought or word, or a helpful act, was required; Arthur Morine could always be depended upon. From a neighborhood in which his whole life was spent he will be missed, and many a man will feel that the world is poorer for lack of his kindly presence.

Only three children are left of a lately complete household. Those are Miss Lulu, on whose young shoulders a heavy burden is laid; Keith aged 14 and Ellen aged 7. To them the sympathy of the whole neighborhood is extended—Kentville Advertiser.

THE FUNERAL OF THE GREAT LAURIER.

The funeral of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, in Ottawa on Saturday last, was one of impressive dignity and grand ceremonial. The cortege from the House of Commons to the Roman Catholic Basilica was a long one and in it the Church of all creeds in Canada was fully represented; and the State, with the Governor General at the head, showed honor to the memory of the departed Statesman by a full attendance of State Officials.

The services at the Basilica were solemn and majestic and eloquent words of eulogy in both English and French spoken by dignitaries of the Church to which Sir Wilfrid was so much attached.

The procession to the Cemetery, three miles away, was thru streets lined with tens of thousands of people. It was the greatest funeral ceremonial ever seen in the Capital of our Dominion.

He was educated at Dalhousie and Pine Hill College, Halifax.

Besides his widow, who was a Miss McClellan, of Noel, N. S., he leaves two children, his mother and two sisters one of the latter being seriously ill overseas.

The late Mr. McIntosh was highly esteemed, and his death is universally regretted.
