## REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON REGISTRATION.

Your Committee beg to report, as follows -

First. Xinoty-muo additional mombers of the College of Physicians and Surgeons have been registered since January 1st, 1870. The number of students registered since the last meeting of the Council is one hundred and fity-mue, of whom seventy-mine passed the examination before the examiners of this College– sixty-two in Toronto and soit enteen in Kingston, the remaining olgity matriculated prior to 1860, in the various colleges of Ontario and Quebec.

Second. The case of a student having been allowed to matrienlate a few days after the time appointed for holding the examination, and a doubt having arisen as to the propriety of registoring him your Committee, while accepting the examiner's cortificate, recommend that, for the fature, irregularities of this kind should not be permitted without most satisfactory reasons.

Third. As some doubts appear to have arison in regard to the interpretation of Section 23, Subsection 2, of the Ontario Medical Act. your Committee are of the opinion, that persons applying for registration ander this clause, must produce ovidence of having been actually practising medicine prior to January 1st, 1850, and of having attended one course of lectures at any recognized medical school prior to such application.

Fourth. Your Commuteo recoved a communication in regard to the right of a porson registered as holding a certificate of the Eelectic Medical Board, and also a licentiate of the Royal Collego of Physicians and Surgeons, Kingston, to withdraw the registration of the former diploma, and retain-the latter only. Upon this your Commuteo recommend, that any person having two or more qualifications ontered in the Register, may, at any time, by signifying his wish to the Register in writing, have any number of said qualifications or additions erased from the Register, provided that ta least one qualification romains.

Fifth. The following gentlomen have announced themssives as candidates for the office of Registrar :--Drs. Joseph Howson and George Wright, of Toronto; Dr. Trew, of Nowcastle, and Dr. Tack, of Guelph. Your Committee are of the opnion that the business of the Council would be greatly facilitated if the Registrar and Treasure resided in the same place.
