

GAYTON, ALBERT. [*Yarmouth.*]

Eld. s. of James Gayton, Esq., by Miriam, dau. of the late Wm. Hamilton, Esq.; and grands. of Thos. Gayton, Esq., a native of Irel.; other ancestors were U. E. loyalists. B. at Argyll, N.S., 30 Dec. 1840. Ed. there and at Truro. M. 2 Dec. 1862, Helen, dau. of Samuel Hamilton, Esq., of Kemptville. A merchant. First returned to Parlt., for present seat, at g.e. 1871. Re-elected at g.e. 1874, and again at last g.e. A Reformer.—*Lower Argyll, N.S.*

HADLEY, JOS. W. [*Guysboro'.*]

Contested Guysboro' at g.e. 1871, unsuccessfully. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e.—*Guysboro', N.S.*

HARRINGTON, W. D. [*Halifax.*]

First returned to the Legislative Assembly of Nova Scotia, at last g.e.—*Halifax, N.S.*

HOLMES, SIMON H. [*Pictou.*]

S. of Hon. John Holmes, Senator. B. at East River, Pictou, 1839. Ed. at the Grammar School, New Glasgow, and the Pictou Academy. M. 23 Dec. 1874, Isabella J., eld. dau. of James Little, Esq., of Haliburton Stream, Pictou. Called to the Bar, N.S., 1865. Has been editor and proprietor of the *Colonial Standard* (Pictou), for the past fourteen years. An unsuccessful candidate for Pictou at g.e. 1867. First returned to Parlt., for present seat, at g.e. 1871; again returned, by acclamation, at g.e. 1874; re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Pictou, N.S.*

JAMES, EDWARD. (*Lunenburg.*)

Of English and German descent. S. of Arthur James, and grands. of Edward James, who was High Sheriff of the Co. Lunenburg, N.S., for some years, and mem. of the N.S. Parlt. B. at Lunenburg, N.S., in 1825. Ed. in Lunenburg. M. in Lunenburg, 1853, Eliza, dau. of Phillip and Elizabeth Lantz, of the same place. Has been captain of the Garrison Artillery of Active Militia since 1867. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*Mahone Bay, Co. Lunenburg, N.S.*
