To Our Beloved and Faithful the Senators of the Dominion of Canada, and the Members elected to serve in the House of Commons of Our said Dominion, and to each and every of you—Greeting:

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, the meeting of Our Parliament of Canada stands prorogued to the THIRTMENTH day of the month of January instant, Nevertheless, for certain causes and considerations, We have thought fit further to prorogue the same to Thursday, the Eighth day of the month of February next, so that neither you, nor any of you on the said Thirtmenth day of January instant, at Our City of Ottawa, to appear are to be held and constrained: for We do will that you and each of you, be as to Us, in this matter, entirely exonerated; commanding, and by the tenor of these presents enjoining you, and each of you, and all others in this behalf interested, that on Thursday, the Eighth day of the month of February next, at Our City of Ottawa aforesaid, personally you be and appear, for the Despaton of Business, to treat, do, act and conclude upon those things which in Our said Parliament of Canada by the Common Council of Our said Dominion, may, by the favour of God, be ordained.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. WITNESS. JOHN J. At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this Fourth day of January, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the Forty-sixth year of Our Reign.
