"In The Right Place" Dr. John (Atco-WEA SD7018). Yes, Dr. John's in the right place at all right. New Orleans funk at it's utmost funkiest is the message here. The combined talents of Mac Rebennack (Dr. John) and producer-arranger Allen Toussaint are a winning team.

To kick things off there's Right Place Wrong Time, a song that best exemplify's the "New Orleans School of Funky Music". But the beauty of this record is the transitions from tunes like Qualified which is a sure fire hit to the simple elegance of Just The Same.

Almost every cut has something different to offer, a piano lick here, a brass chart there, or Dr. John's lazy yet always exciting vocals. Dr. John has been around for a long time with a

rather small but loyal following, this is the album that will put him over the top, where he belongs.

"Second Album" Roy Buchanan (Polydor PD5046). Roy Buchanan has delivered. His first album, while showing off his amazing guitar work, was flawed with weak material and superfluous vocals. He must have felt the same way, this one is pure and searing.

He pulls notes out of a Telecaster that I didn't think existed. From the opening bars of Filthy Teddy to his tasteful use of harmonics in Tribute To Elmore James, the man struts his stuff and never ceases to amaze. Listen for yourself, then try to think of somebody who could cut him... You'll probably give up.

Batteaux (Columbia KC 32063). Batteaux are the

result of two insignificant but very good folk bands, Appolosa and Compton and Batteaux. Robin Batteaux has been in them both and now brother David has joined him to produce what is probably the finest folk-type record I've heard in months.

The album took me a few listenings to get into but one song Treat Me Right, Treat Me Wrong, kept on pulling me back until I decided I had better hear what went before and after this gem. Well they're all gems. It's a very low key sound, with plenty of emphasis on vocal harmonies and haunting melodies. The instrumentation is precise and always relevant. A fine record from people who care about their music. What a refreshing change.

Living Together, Growing Together The Fifth Dimension (Bell 1116). A group that I have always looked to for quality music has let me down. This is a very boring album. The tunes are boring the singing sounds very uninspired and even the cover is lifeless, in fact it's five dolls, could that mean something? I wonder!
