May it please your Ex^{ty}.

Your Ex^{ty}'s most acceptable Favours of y^e 5th Inst^{ce}
we Read and are very glad for y^e kind Assurances your Ex^{ty}
pleased to give us that you intend to Employ your thoughts
very much for the security of our frontiers which is very
much of his Majesties Service & Advantage of all his Subjects
in this Continent, if there be no Encouragement to support
the Credit for y^e present Service we are at a loss how it will
be supported unless we engage our selves for it.

Pursuant to y^e Ex^{ty}'s Commands we have agreed with
a fitt person, to go to Oswego who understands Bleeding and
Physick named M^r. Charles Kerr of the Govern^{ment}
for a year to commence from the time we can send him thither
at his Return thither to be p^d on Certificate from the Comm^{rs}
officer he has serv^d that time, we shall supply him with
some wine Rum & sugar for the use of the sick men and hope
that the next Assembly will provide for the payment of this
& all other Incidents that may accrue for the Imediate main-
tenance without which the settlement at Oswego cant be
maintaind, in what manner & when we shall send M^r. Kerr
to Oswego we cant tell to hire people on purpose will cost
at least £120 more when more provisions be sent thither
he may conveniently go without much charge to y^e Publick
however if it be your Ex^{ty}'s pleasure we shall send him directly
& hire men for that purpose
