Sir,-

In reply to your letter of the 21st instant,

I beg to inform you that this letter taken with that of the
10th instant is rather confusing. You say in the latter
that in the matter of sencing and rebuilding the platform
you find that \$30.00 mill cover the expense as the Indians
have consented to perform a goodly share of the labor. In
your letter of the 21st instant you say that the probable cost
of fencing the grounds would be \$81.00 and the platform and
the rape \$21.00. You may have a new platform built and purchase
a rope but if the fencing is to cost \$81.00 the funds of the
Band will not be able to stand such a charge at present.
