Enclosed please find application from Mr. Wm. G. Lawson of Alert Bay, B. C., to purchase the merchantable timber on Mamalillikulla Indian Reserve #1, belonging to the Mamalillikulla Band of this Agency.

Evidently Mr. Lawson is acting as Agent and has offered to pay Three Dollars and Seventy-Five Cents (\$3.75) per M. B. C. Log Scale; and estimates the cruise at six and one-half million feet (6,500,000'); and requests three (3) years to remove same. I enclose you, herewith, certified cheque in the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-Four Dollars and Thirty-Five Cents (\$2,574.35), made up as follows:-
