After the passing of this act, certain Se.

duties to be raised, and after the paffing of this Act, there shall be raised, levied, collected and paid for and upon the respective goods, wares, and Merchandize herein after mentioned. which shall be imported or brought into any part of this Province from any place or places from whence the same may be legally imported, over and above all other duties now charged and payable thereon in this Province under any Acts of of the Parliament of Great Britain or of the Provincial Parliament of this Province, the several rates and duties following, that is to say; first, for every pound, "Avoir-" du-pois" Weight of refined Sugar, one penny Currency; secondly, for every pound like weight of leaf tobacco, three pence Currency; thirdly, for every pound like weight of tobacco manufactured in any other way than into fruff, or that may have undergone any process, change or alteration for the purpose of preparing it for the more easy manufacture into any other form or altering its nature from the leaf in any degree, fix pence currency : fourthly, for every pound like weight of funff, four pence currency; fifthly, for every minot of Salt, eight pence currency; fixthly, for every gallon, of Madeira Wine, one shilling currency; severishly, for every

gallon of Port Wine, one shilling, currency; eighthly for every gallon of Rum, fix hence currency ; and, for every gallon of foreign Brandy or Gin, one failling, currency; and after those rates for any greater or less quantity of luch goods, respec-

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every person who shall take out a licence for keeping a House or other place of public entertainment in the Cities of Quebec or Montreal or suburbs thereof, or in the Town of Three. Rivers, shall pay for each and every licence the sum of ten Pounds currency over and above the duties such person is at present by law bound to pay, and that every person who shall take out a licence to keep a House or other place of Public entertainment in the Banlieues of the faid Cities or Town, or in any part of the Province, shall pay for each and every Licence, the sum of five Pounds currency, over and above the duties such person is at present by law bound to pay.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every person who shall take out a licence to hold for his profit or gain any Billiard Table in this Province, over and above the duties he is at present bound to pay under the law, shall for each and every such Licence pay seven Pounds ten shillings, currency.
