RAILWAY MAGNATE PASSES

Death of Mr. David McNicoll.

ONE of the most remarkable of the many famous men connected with the Canadian Pacific Railway passed away on Sunday with the death of Mr. David McNicoll at Guelph, Ont. From the day of his birth at Arbroath, Scotland, in 1852, up to the day of his death, the life of the late first vice-president of the C. P. R. was a fascinating study. Many men have abilities high as those that were possessed by David McNicoll, but few can apply them to the exertions that are needed for the development of passenger lines as he applied himself. At an early age he saw his life work before him as plainly as a great ladder standing against a wall.

Little is known of David McNicoll the child and schoolboy, but in 1866—the year the English invaded Canada from the United States—we are told that the lad then aged 14 years, took up the post of clerk with the North British Railway Company in Scotland and in 1873 he got a position as clerk with the North Midland Railway Company.
