BEE-KEEPERS' ASSOCIATION.

STAYFORD, Jan. 28.—Yesterday morning the Ontario Bee-keepers' Association met for the purpose of concluding an unfinished business which consisted mainly in discussion of papers given the previous day by Messrs. Darling and Gemmill. A general discussion on the wintering of bees furnished valuable information as each member gave his experience. Mr. Pettit said it was possible to winter bees as successfully and with much certainty as any other stock and showed how it should be done.

AT Wednesday's session a resolution was passed providing each member of the association with a copy of the Canadian Bee Journal. The legality of the resolution was questioned and a motion to rescind it carried by a vote of 10 to 8.

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OTTAWA'S CARNIVAL.

OTTAWA, Jan. 28.—The allegorical drive yesterday afternoon was one of the greatest affairs ever witnessed in the city. The drive formed on Carleton square at two o'clock sharp. From the square the cars passed down Kent street, where they were shown to their different sections by members of the committee.

The procession was in charge of the gentlemen of the Ottawa Riding Club, with Mr. T. C. Bate as grand marshal and Messrs. H. Brown and A. H. Powell as assistant grand marshals. After the procession formed it took the following route: Proceeding north on Maria street to the bridge to Theodores, Theodores to Nelson, Nelson to Daly, Daly to Cumberland, Cumberland to Church, Church to Dalhousie to St. Patrick, St. Patrick to MacKenzie avenue, along MacKenzie avenue through the living arch to Lyngar, Lyngar to Kent, Kent to MacLaren, MacLaren to Metcalfe to Maria.

Thousands witnessed the drive along the route. It is calculated that some ten thousand people reached the city yesterday by the different lines of railway running into the city.

The starting of the ice palace, which was the event of the week, was witnessed from Parliament hill and all the points from which New Year Point was visible. The attack was made from the Hill shore and was very successful in every particular.

OTTAWA, Jan. 28.—The carnival closed Saturday night with the hockey match. It is believed that it has been a great success. The outside visitors to the winter carnival during the present week have numbered at the lowest estimate 10,000 people, the same number as was claimed by the last Montreal carnival. Among the spectators were included farmers from the surrounding district, who visited the capital with their wives and families. If numbers there were to make up success, and they certainly contribute in a large measure, the Ottawa carnival has been connected with anything but failure.

MEXICAN-Guatemalan DISPUTE.
War seems inevitable between these two countries.

CITY OF MEXICO, Jan. 28.—The morning newspapers preserve silence as to the government's programme in the dispute with Guatemala. At the departments all inquiries are met with absolute refusal to discuss the situation, although an official statement in the next issue is hinted.

Guatemala's reply to Mexico's list of demands is still a cabinet secret, although numbers will run up to his contents are spread hourly. There was a report that Senator Mariscal, of the foreign office, had received notice from Guatemala that he was ready to grant Mexico's request as to the frontier lands and to indemnify the country of the expenses incurred incidentally to the dispute. This report was denied officially. An extra force of men were ordered to the frontier to guard the twenty-fifth infantry regiment is here preparing for heavy marching.

NIAGARA RIVER SMUGGLING.
It still exists but not to a large extent.

BUFAALO, Jan. 28.—An article sent out from this city, news of a man who had been arrested for smuggling goods into Canada, has been widely reported. It implies that the Canadian customs officers have in their attention to duty and give a bold statement of customs receipts at this port which is misleading.

OTTAWA, Jan. 28.—The following officers were elected by the P. P. A. convention: President, Mr. Busby; Vice-President, Mr. Owen; Secretary, Mr. Parkhill; Treasurer, Mr. Jackson; and a number of the delegates remained to attend the winter of the province.

Mr. Busby, of Owen Sound, succeeds to the Presidency.
