THEREAS by an Act passed by the Legilature of this Colony, n the 41st year of the Reign of Her the fishery of Lobsters," it is enacted, that "The Governor in Council may, after such public enquiry and notice as shall be deemed expedient, from time to time, by order, restrict, or prohibit, either entirely or subject to any exceptions and regulations, the fishing for and or part of Districts in this Colony named in the Order, during such period either in every year or in such number of years as may be limited by the Order and may by the Order provide for enforcing the Order and any restriction or regulation contained therein, by fines under this Act, shall be pub ished in the Royal Gazette and one other News paper in the Colony, for the period of One Month before the same shall take effect;" and that all ofiences against this Act, or against any Order made in pursuance of this Act, may be prosecuted, and all fines under this Act or any such Order, may be recovered with cosof suit, on summary conviction before a Stipendiary Magistrate; and in des fault of payment of any fine, the same may be recovered by distress and sale of the offenders Goods and Chattles; or in case of such default he may be committed to prison for a period not ex ceeding Three Months, or until pay.
