ATTEMPT AT REBELLION IN BRITISH SOUTH AFRICA.

CAPE TOWN, Sept. 10. Details of an attempt to foment another rebellion in South Africa, were disclosed at a trial yesterday at Bloemfontein of two nationalists, Van Der Merwe and Schuiken, on a charge of high treason. The men are alleged to have approached a number of prominent Boers, including General De Wet, to whom they told that large stores of rifles were available, and that certain Boer Generals were willing to lead a revolt. General De Wet who informed the Government of the movement, testified that he warned the men against attempting another uprising. The hearing was adjourned.

BRITISH CAPTURE TRENCH.

LONDON, Sept. 10. The British captured a German trench in Highwood, on the Somme front, after sharp fighting, last night, it is announced officially to-day. German troops made several attacks during the night, but none of them in force. The statement follows: Last night there was some sharp hand-to-hand fighting in Highwood, where we captured a German trench, taking two officers and 19 Bavarians. In this operation heavy casualties were inflicted on the enemy. There has been considerable hostile artillery activity against our front north of Pozieres and in the neighborhood of Mousquet Farm. In this sector small hostile infantry attacks were easily repulsed. A detachment of the enemy which attempted to advance from the direction of Courcette was stopped by our fire. Our troops carried out several successful enterprises in the neighborhood of Arras and the Hohenzollern redoubt and north of Neuve Chapelle the enemy trenches were entered. Some prisoners were taken and other casualties were inflicted.

FURTHER GAINS ON SOMME FRONT

LONDON, Sept. 10. The British made further gains on the Somme front last night. This was announced officially to-day. The statement follows: All ground gained yesterday has been maintained and gains were further extended last night. This morning prisoners are still coming in. The full number taken cannot yet be stated. A counter attack northeast of Pozieres during the night was easily beaten off. As a result of the heavy fighting during the past week our line has been advanced on a front of six thousand yards to a depth varying from three hundred to three thousand yards. Severe defeats and heavy losses have been inflicted on the enemy. The important and strongly defended localities of Falfont farm, Gullimont and Ginchy have been wrested from him. The spirit and dash of our troops during this severe fighting in the face of frequent and determined counter attacks and constant intense artillery fire, has been magnificent. The fine work of the Irish troops from Connaught, Leinster and Munster, already mentioned in connection with the capture of Gullimont, was carried on yesterday by the same troops in the attack on Ginchy. Some of our rifle regiments from Warwickshire, Kent, Devonshire, Gloucester, Surrey, Cornwall, Wales and Scotland, were also engaged. All the fighting of the past week has been splendid work.

FRENCH GAINS.

PARIS, Sept. 10. Renewing their assaults on the Somme front last night, the French made further gains. The capture of a small wooded area is reported to-day by the War Office. German attacks in the Verdun section were repulsed.

BRITISH OCCUPY GINCHY.

LONDON, Sept. 10. The British statement officially says that Ginchy was wholly occupied last night, as well as the territory between the village and Leuze Wood. The Austrians are retreating before the Russians, blowing up forts and bridges. The French have assaulted and taken a section of German trenches east of Fleury. German counter attacks were repulsed.

SUCCESSFUL RAID.

LONDON, Sept. 10. British aviators carried out another series of raids, directed against German aerial establishments in Belgium. The latest attack is described officially as follows: Our aeroplanes attacked the enemy's aerodromes at Chistelles and Handzame. A large number of bombs were dropped with satisfactory results. All the machines returned.

SERBIANS CAPTURE HEIGHT.

PARIS, Sept. 10. The Serbians on the Macedonian front took the offensive last night in the region of Lake Ostroy, and the War Office announced to-day that after a violent engagement they captured a height west of the Lake.

HALICZ FORTS BLOWN UP.

LONDON, Sept. 10. The Austrians have begun to blow up the forts of Halicz in Galicia, according to despatches published by the Petrograd Russiky Slav, forwarded by Reuter's correspondent. The Russians have occupied some of them. The great bridge across the Dnieper, it adds, has been blown up. The Russians hold the left bank of the river and are cannonading the retreating Austrians. Two railway trains have been wrecked.

THE WATERMELON.

The watermelon is a pleasing and harmless beverage which is 20 per cent. water and 80 per cent. seeds, much on the order of Sunday-school lemonade. Owing to the lack of alcohol in the watermelon, it is much in favor with the clergy and can be shipped into a dry state without requiring the customer to swear that it is bought for medicinal purposes only.

Watermelons are grown largely in the south and are used to sustain and inflate the colored brother. When a greedy, wabble-jointed cotton hand has wrapped himself around a thirty-pound watermelon and settled back for a sonorous nap, he will look as if somebody had attached a tire pump to him and forgotten to shut off the engine. The look of perfect contentment which fastens itself upon the face of a Georgia darkey who has eaten six or eight two-story watermelons, seeds and all, is enough to cause a hardened dyspeptic to jump off the lake front.

The watermelon has been grown in this country for a hundred years and thousands have been eaten by our college professors and other shining intellects, but nobody has ever discovered a way to prevent it from running to seeds and clogging up the windpipe of the trustful northerner. The watermelon would be served at polite social functions more if it were not for the harrowing fear on the part of the hostess that some nervous male guest will get a few seeds upside down in his neck and have to be operated on with a pair of duck-bill pliers. To a country which boasts the incubator baby and the

non-corrosive banana the presence of the watermelon seed is a standing reproach.

RUSSIANS GAIN GROUND.

BERLIN, Sept. 10. South of Dorna Watera in Southern Bukowina, near the Roumanian-Hungarian borders, the Germans have come in contact with Roumanian forces, the War Office announced to-day. The Russians have gained ground west of Siplat on the Carpathians, near Zeabl.

RUSSIANS BOMBARD ROUMANIAN PORT.

PETROGRAD, Sept. 10. Russian torpedo boats, it is declared, bombarded the Roumanian port of Baltjik, on the Black Sea, and sank 21 barges, on which the Bulgars, who had occupied the seaport, were shipping bread.

KING FERDINAND TO CONFER WITH GERMAN EMPEROR.

BERLIN, Sept. 10. King Ferdinand of Bulgaria, says an official statement issued here, accompanied by the Crown Prince and Chief of the Bulgarian Cabinet, arrived at the main headquarters to confer with the German Emperor.

ROUMANIAN OFFICIAL.

BUCHAREST, Sept. 10. The Bulgarians have been driven from Bazardjik or Olobric, in southeastern Roumania, by Russian and Roumanian troops, says an official communication issued by the Roumanian war office yesterday. In Northern Transylvania the Roumanians have occupied Alah Tapiltza and five other towns. An enemy attack south of Mehadia, 15 miles north of Orsova on the Danube was repulsed. On the southern front Russian and Roumanian troops drove the Bulgarians from Bazardjik, Dobric and Dobaszi. Enemy aeroplanes bombed Constantza on the Roumanian Black Sea coast, wounding two women and a child.

Austria Now Ready to Make Peace With Allies

London, Aug. 31.—An event of supreme importance, far transcending that of the intervention of Rumania and the prospective entry of Greece into the war, is awaited now at any moment by the Chancelleries of the countries of the Allies. This is the so-called coup d'etat by Hungary.

The formal separation of this kingdom from the Austrian Empire is affirmed in authoritative circles in Italy, where relations with Hungary of an informal kind have during the last few weeks been quite close, to be now inevitable and of imminent occurrence. It was only able diplomatic work on the part of the Austrian statesmen which prevented a break before now.

The vitally interesting fact in this connection is that Hungary is expected at once to make separate peace. Another extraordinary feature of the event which is being watched for is the fact that the chief burden of responsibility for it will be placed on the shoulders of the statesmen of Prussia.

Treachorous Deed's Retribution.
Prussia, the Tribune says, is likely bitterly to reject the treacherous deed which it has committed against Austria in supporting the leaders of the separatist movement of Hungary.

It is expected that the very powerful party led by Count Karoly already has completed all the necessary measures for the sudden cutting loose from the Austrian empire. When the hour for the coup d'etat arrives it first will be accomplished, and then application will be made in the Hungarian Parliament for its formal legalization.

The step taken will be a formal demand that Hungary take charge of her own defences. With Russian military forces in the Carpathians and with Roumanian troops over the border in Transylvania, the Hungarian constitution will be invoked in behalf of the action decided upon—namely, the recall of all the Hungarian Hottveds into Hungarian territory and under the direct command of Hungarian military chiefs.
