IN LABOR'S FIELD.

The Great Strike of British Cotton Spinners Begun

Serious Labor Upheaval in New Orleans The Toronto Typos' Trouble.

LONDON, Nov. 6.—England sees the beginning of what seems likely to be the greatest industrial war that the country has known in many years. Cotton mills employing 14,000,000 spindles were shut down yesterday. Of the 44,000,000 spindles in England the mill owners have a masters' federation in which 20,000,000 spindles are represented. The owners of the 6,000,000 still running will pay to the federation a fine of a farthing a spindle per week for such as they keep at work. There are about 24,000 operative spinners grouped into various local unions all federated in an amalgamated association of could apply the spinlings. The local unions combined have a reserve fund of £120,000. This will be further increased by the contributions of 4 shillings a week from 9,000 members, who will remain at work. From all sources £3.400 will flow in weekly to assist the

The union men hope for one great result from the struggle, thinking it will induce outsiders to join the unions with a view to a share in the "strike pay" later. The Masters' Federation has received a severe blow at Bolton, where the district employers' association has declined to co-operate with the federation in a scheme to reduce wages. Their 13,000,000 spindles are still kept busy, and the operatives are working on the old scale of wages.

New Orleans, Nov. 6.—Yesterday the street cay arivers all left work and tied up all the lines in the city. The cotton handlers did hot go out. The merchants are willing to arbitrate with the unions if they will send their men back to work while the strikers demand that all the differences be settled before the men return to work.
