

Medical Students Arouse Ire of Principal Radcliffe

Privileges at Collegiate Will Be Canceled If Their Conduct Is Not Better in Future.

The conduct of the medical students who attend the Collegiate Institute was the subject of a rather lively debate at a meeting of the board of education last night. Principal Radcliffe brought the matter up by making a verbal complaint to the trustees, and in no uncertain tones the board decided to put a stop to the pranks of the students at once. The students, as is well known, are allowed the privilege of attending the college at certain hours for the purpose of receiving instruction in certain subjects, and it is upon these occasions that their conduct has aroused the displeasure of the principal.

Mr. Radcliffe stated that he was much dissatisfied with the conduct of the students. They are most unruly, and set a bad example for the other pupils, Mr. Radcliffe said. He declared he was not anxious that the board should deal too harshly with the students just now, but he recommended that they be properly disciplined, and that the dean of the college be communicated with by the board.

Trustee MacRobert moved that the students' privileges at the Collegiate be canceled. He had no desire to injure the Medical School, but for one, did not propose to allow any class of students to hurt the Collegiate Institute. He recalled that some years ago a certain chairman of the board had suffered seriously at the hands of these students, while they were playing their pranks.

Trustee Tillmann said he was connected with the Medical School, and he could not but regard Trustee MacRobert's statements as an insult. He was present at the scene referred to by Mr. MacRobert, and he could tell the trustees that the action of the students on that occasion was not disgraceful.

Trustee Teasdale said he had been informed that the students had acted in a most unbecoming manner, coming to and from the school, and, of course, a stop would have to be put to this conduct.

It was finally moved by Trustee Blackwell, seconded by Trustee Strong, that the dean be notified that unless

the students conduct themselves in a proper manner their privileges at the Collegiate Institute will be canceled. This motion carried.

Resignation Accepted.

The board accepted the resignation of Mr. S. B. McCready, head science master at the Collegiate Institute, who has been appointed to a position in the Macdonald Institute, Guelph, by the Ontario Government. Mr. F. A. Stuart, was on recommendation of Principal Radcliffe, promoted to the position vacated by Mr. McCready, and the secretary was authorized to advertise at once for a teacher to fill Mr. Stuart's place.

Inspector Edwards and Principal Radcliffe were authorized to visit several of the larger American cities for the purpose of securing educational pointers for the benefit of London schools.

On the recommendation of No. 1 committee, the board decided that in future all teachers appointed to permanent positions must pass a medical examination.

The board refused to grant the request of the Egerton Street Baptist Church to be allowed to use the Chesley avenue school for a place of worship while repairs are being made to the church. The trustees took the ground that the schools are for a specific purpose, and that it would be a bad precedent to grant the request.

Principal Radcliffe's report for January showed that during the month there had been an average attendance at the Collegiate Institute of 710. This is an increase of 81 over January a year ago.

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Chairman Yeates, Trustees Fitzgerald, MacRobert, English and McCormick were also named a committee to revise the rules and regulations of the board.
