TURN CLOCKS BACK TO STANDARD TIME MIDNIGHT SATURDAY

Council Decides Unanimously to Oust Daylight-Saving.

RAILWAY BYLAWS PASS

Extensions Will Be Made on a Basis of 47,000 Population.

Turn the clocks back one hour at midnight on Saturday night. The city council at a special meeting held yesterday afternoon decided unanimously to return to standard time. There was no discussion, and when the bylaw was presented, there was not a vote registered against it.

Later Controller Rose submitted a motion to make the change effective on Saturday night at midnight, and this was also carried without objection. The much promised debate did not materialize.

The bylaws amending the bylaws relative to the London street railway were also passed without discussion. The changes were not material. They simply limited the population at 47,000 plus 4,675 feet of extensions for street railway purposes. This means that the population will be about 47,000.

STORIES OF BRITISH NAVAL HEROISM

acted as if waiting for some one to tell her what to do. Her men seemed disorganized and beyond control. She luffed up sharp, then fell into staves and drifted down on the Shannon, her port quarter getting foul of the Shannon's starboard masts. This is exactly what the British would have preferred to happen. Just then the powder box on her quarter deck exploded, whether from the Shannon's fire or not, she never knew. In the twinkling of an eye a great flame burst up as high as her tops, which were covered with sharpshooters, whose position became anything but comfortable.

The men at the guns were driven off by the explosion and all became disorder and confusion. Quick to take advantage of the conditions on the enemy's deck, Brock called aloud for boarders. He

"Waved his sword,
And cried aloud, "Now, my lads, aboard
And we'll stop their Yankee Doodle
Dandy—Andy—O!"

and led his men, and literally drove many of the enemy below decks. In the meantime, Stevenson, an old-timer boatwain—lashed the two ships together, for he knew of old that at close quarters the British sailor is without a peer. But the poor old chap, in the doing of it, lost his left arm, which was completely hacked from the shoulder by a stroke from a cutlass.

By this time the top-wards of the two ships were jammed together and the mainmast of the Chesapeake was carried by a plucky midshipman, William Smith, who, like a squirrel, jumping from branch to branch of different trees, ran along the Shannon's foreyard to the enemy's mainyard, and so gained the top. Another midshipman named Cosmahen reached the enemy's mizen-top in the same way, and fired shot after shot in quick succession from muskets handed him by his topmen. In less than fifteen minutes after the ships locked horns the enemy was beaten and the crowds in the mainmast, Stevenson's back to the harbor as speedily as possible, not quite knowing how it all happened. But in many ways it was, indeed, a sorry victory. By some deplorable error the British flag was run up on the Shannon in reverse order. At once her guns opened fire, killing her first lieutenant and several of her own men before the terrible mistake was discovered. In the mix-up, it was not easy to distinguish, and because of this, that little mistake made by some one, cost the Shannon the life of a splendid young officer, besides that of the mainmast. Capt. Lawrence of the Chesapeake, lay in his cabin slowly dying of his wounds, while the gallant captain of the Shannon was so grievously wounded that the command devolved upon Lieut. Wallis, who took the ship with her prize into Halifax, amidst the cheers of the people and of the crews of the ships anchored in harbor. Capt. Lawrence was buried at Halifax with all naval honors, and two years later his body was restored to the country in whose behalf he fought and died. The diary of Capt.
