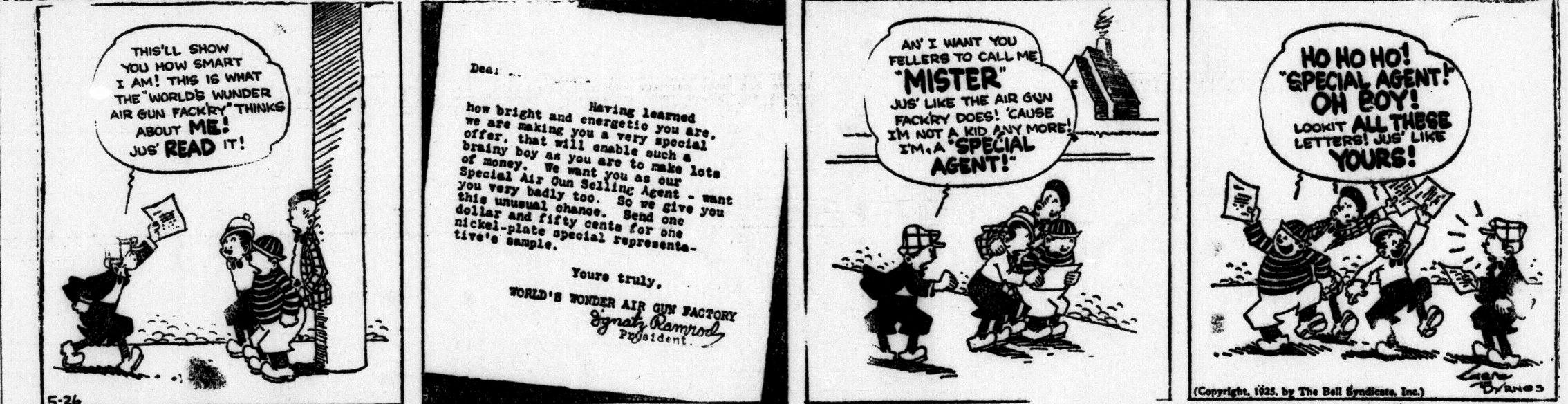

This device, which is the invention of Harry B. Sherman, construction engineer of the Saskatchewan government telephone system, is designed to insure the secrecy, long desired, in the operation of rural and party line service, and if the invention proves successful under further trials, it will have a far-reaching effect upon service of this kind throughout the entire world, it is said.

Like most successful inventions, the lock out device, as the telephone engineers call it, is simple in construction and can be installed at a nominal cost.
