Dressed hogs in good supply and easier at \$5.75 to \$6.25. There was a large supply of dressed meats. Boef, forequarters, \$6 to 4½c a pound; hindquarters, \$6 to 7c; mutton, 9c to 9½c; yeal, 8½c to 9½c.

The demand, however, was fair for everything and the market was pretty well cleaned out. bout half-a-dozen loads were taken through to Montreal. Prices were a little firmer. Good loads sold at 33/c to 33/c a lb., medium at 3c to 3/d and inferior at 39/c to 3c. Picked lots of animals. weighing 1000 to 1100 pounds sold freely at 4c.
