CHILD VAGRANTS PARDONED

REMARKABLE CASE OF EXERCISE OF THE EXECUTIVE CLEMENCY.

tional Council of Women of Canada, OTTAWA, Jan. 16 .- A very remarkable ase of the exercise of clemency on the part of the Crown has just occurred here. which goes to show how curious the ways of the law sometimes are. Some time ago a man named Cardwell was convicted at the North Lanark Assizes of bigamy and sent to the penitentiary. His first wife died soon after, leaving two child-ren, Gilbert, aged 8, and Bertha, 10. The children were entirely alone and helpless by their mother's death, and the only thing the county authorities could do with them was to have them committed to the county jail as vagrants. This was done. Some kind-hearted people of Perth, where the jail is situated, became interested in the case and made arrangements for the children being taken care of in an orphanage in Kingston. But here a difficulty arose, the children had been formally committed as criminals and as such had to remain in jail. The only way to get them out was by invoking an exercise of executive clemency, and this was at once done. A petition was addressed to His Excellency the Governor-General setting forth the facts of the case, and he on the advice of the Attorney-General for Canada promptly ordered their release.
