YORK COUNTY COUNCIL

Formal Proceedings on the Opening of the Spring Session.

The June sitting of the York County Council was inaugurated yesterday afternoon. The members were Messrs. McCormack and McClelland.

On motion of Messrs. Peggley and Hill the chair was taken by J. C. Stokes, King of the absent of Warden Stephenson.

Various communications were read, the most important of which were one from the School Board of North Toronto asking that entrance examinations be held for that town instead of sending pupils away as formerly, and that admission be allowed with Toronto Junction. Samuel Wall, a teacher, wrote asking \$25 damages sustained by him when crossing the temporary bridge over the Ebbwkele River last winter with a load of furniture.

Mr. Evans stated that he had received a letter from the Weston Board of Education asking for the rate of 10 cents per line for the advertising of the terms of convictions, and that his tender was the other paper at 12 cents per line. The matter was laid over on motion of Mr. Pegg until the Warden puts in a report of the Commissioners for Dundas Street, showing an expenditure of \$11,325.25.

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Non-Collected Taxes.
Mr. Evans gave notice that to-morrow he would move that the County Treasurer be directed to pay to the local municipalities the amount of non-collected taxes returned to him by the treasurers of local municipalities.

Metropolitan Railway and the County.

MARKETS CLOSED STRONGER.

WALL-STREET SECURITIES WERE FAIRLY ACTIVE.

Canadian Stocks Bull But Firm.—The Regular Dividend Declared by Canadian Pacific-Sugar Trust Very strong at Close.—Provisional Market at Chicago.

MONDAY EVENING, June 11.
Local stocks were very quiet to-day, but the feeling ruled firm.

The earnings of Canadian Pacific for the first week of June were \$317,000, a decrease of \$85,000 as compared with same week last year.

Consols weaker, closing at 100 15-16 for money and at 101 for account.

Canadian Pacific lower, closing at 65 1/2 in London. A sale was made in New York at 62 1/2.

The loans of New York banks are \$465,400,000 as compared with \$446,000,000 a year ago, while deposits amount to \$370,880,000, as against \$415,425,000 a year ago.

At the regular meeting to-day at Montreal the Canadian Pacific directors declared a quarterly dividend of 2 1/2 per cent. on common stock.

The net earnings of the Imperial Bank for the year ended May 31 were \$535,075, out of which dividends of 9 per cent. were paid and \$50,000 carried to reserve account, which fund now aggregates \$1,192,252.

A wire from Winnipeg says: "As far as Manitoba is concerned, we are paraded in July for about five weeks, not a drop. If this continues it is a blue outlook for everyone. Complaints are becoming general."

The amount of wheat on passage is 41,416,000, a decrease of \$4,000 bushels during the week. A year ago the amount afloat was 44,730,000 and two years ago 32,160,000 bushels.

Corn afloat 6,384,000 bushels, an increase of 240,000 bushels for the week.

India shipments of wheat the past week were 200,000 bushels.

Imports into the United Kingdom the past week: Wheat, 650,000 qrs.; maize, 114,000 qrs.; flour, 219,000 barrels.

The earnings of St. Paul for the first week of June show a decrease of \$130,000.
Henry A. King & Co.'s special wire from Montreal, Que., New York City, New York, says the only stock during the forenoon to show any disposition to advance was the Bank of Montreal, which advanced 1/2 cent. from 110 to 110 1/2. The rest of the market was under the hammer from the start by the bear party on shares that without a very material increase in activity light for that falls that next fall will witness a seaing down of the dividends and the City of Montreal is displaced at the improbability of any action being taken in the warrant suits, and that an effort will be made long to get the control of the property in the city. In the early afternoon a disposition was manifested on the part of traders to bull stocks, but market failed to respond to any effort to advance price, and the stock bought for a turn was thrown overboard generally after a slight loss.
