

### CLARA HAS CONFESSED

Tells the Story of Frank Westwood's Murder.

WHY SHE SHOT THE LAD DOWN.  
Facts As to the Girl's Romantic Career.

For Two Years Was An Heir in a Chicago Livery Stable and Her Sex Was Never Disclosed—Also Offered as a Choir Boy in an Anglican Church in Chicago—Her Sex Discovered by the Toronto Woman—Frank Westwood Suffered From Sexual Perversion—Was in Fact a Female Chastity.

Clara Ford, the mulatto tailor, married Frank Westwood. To Inspector Stark and to Sergeant Detective Reburn she made a full confession of her guilt. The extent and nature of the confession will be made public when the preliminary trial of the accused takes place on the 28th inst.

There were some interesting developments yesterday. The girl was arraigned in the Police Court and pleaded guilty, but subsequently withdrew the plea and entered one of not guilty.

The World also learned some facts which show the murder to have been premeditated, and found at least two witnesses who saw Clara in the vicinity of the Westwood place the day before that of the murder.

It was also learned that for two years the girl masqueraded as a man in a livery stable, that she was a choir boy in an Anglican church there and was confirmed as a boy, her sex subsequently being revealed to the minister by a former Toronto lady.

The motive of the crime has not been ascertained, but it is believed by evidence corroborated by the prisoner's story in that respect, that she had been seduced by a man who had been living with her in a rooming house in the city.

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### \$15,000 THEIR PRICE.

Otto Guelich's Sensational Testimony

AT THE BOODLE INVESTIGATION.  
Implicates A. E. Hewitt and Ex-Ald. J. E. Verral.

The Detroit Contractor Claims That He Was Approached and the Information Conveyed to Him That Unless He Paid \$15,000 He Would Not Secure the Paving Contract, But the Detroit Man Did Not Stand Over the Cash.

The intense interest which is being taken in the boodle investigation was evidenced yesterday by the large attendance of visitors. The court was crowded from first to last. Nor were the visitors weary of the proceedings. The evidence was of a thoroughly sensational character, and the excitement maintained to the finish. The most important witness was Otto E. Guelich, the asphalt man of Detroit. He stated that at a meeting of the Detroit contractors, he was approached by Ex-Ald. J. E. Verral and Ald. Hewitt in the Headquarters Saloon, the former had indicated to him that unless he put up \$15,000 he would not get the contract, and that Hewitt, with whom he was closest privately, immediately afterwards, repeated the assertion. Mr. Guelich, who speaks with a Danish accent, gave his evidence in a straightforward manner, and related details in the minutest particular. He also made a statement that Ex-Ald. Maloney visited him at the Rossin House and asked that if the contract for asphalt was awarded to Guelich, he (Maloney) should be allowed to supply the stone. A sensation was caused at the afternoon session when Guelich agreed to furnish the stone and swore that, after giving his evidence in the morning, Ald. Hewitt had called him a liar and threatened that he should be "slunked" before leaving the town. Contractor John Shields and George Maitland, a partner of Guelich, testified that on July 17, directly after the occurrence, the letter informed them of the proposition alleged to have been made to Guelich, and that he had never given a dollar to influence his tender. Ex-Mayor Fleming was also in the box, but the greater portion of his evidence was postponed to a later date. The evidence was corroborated by the testimony of Mr. Fleming, who was called to the stand on Monday next, when Ald. Hewitt will again be put on the stand.

Ex-Ald. J. E. Verral again went into the box to swear that he had never in his life played cards with any of the contractors interested in the matter of the asphalt tenders.

He described the preliminary arrangement which he had made with the defendants respecting his tender. Mr. Langhlin, his engineer, had told him that some one in the Engineers' office had been in the city for some time, and that he had never laid a yard of pavement in Utica, N.Y. This statement was made to him in the presence of the other tenderers, and he did not know any of the other tenderers, nor did he know any of the other tenderers at that time. 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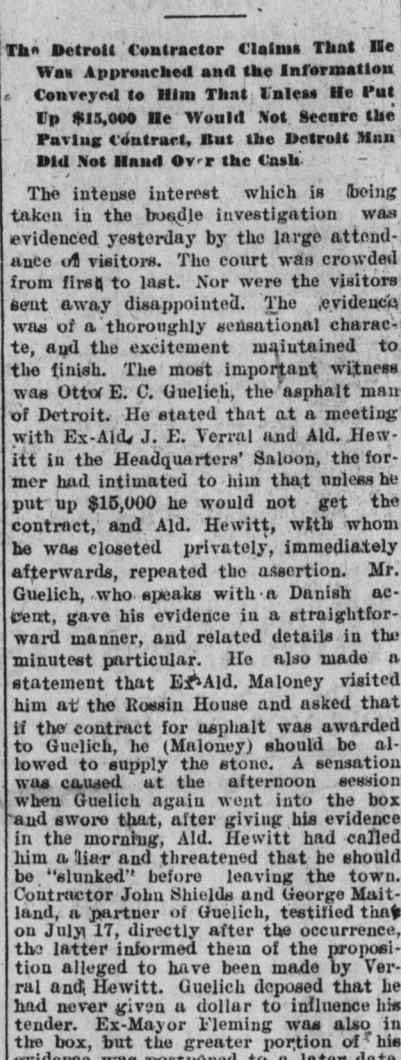

Will Not Receive Armenian Deputations—A. No. 246. PREFERS TORONTO'S QUIETUDE TO TURBULENT CHICAGO.

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Churchgoers Asked for the Cross. "Home cars were started in Chicago to accommodate for churchgoing people. It looked as if Satan had taken charge now. Trains and steam cars take people out for recreation. A prominent minister advocated this, and crowds went to hear him. When the theatres were opened last night, the people went and cannot now close the Chicago theatres on Sunday."

When the newboys ceased shouting their papers at midnight on Saturday and there was quiet till Monday morning, I said: 'The people would not go to a city as Toronto. Would that we had it in the United States.'
