died. During the latter period of his life he was wholly engaged in benevolent enterprises. This was his business. He gave away about £30,000 a-year in this way, and has bequeathed about £164,000 for benevolent objects. He was a member of the U. P. Church. D. Mackerrow, the author of a history of the Secession Church, and lately of a history of the missions of the U. P. Church, is dead.

We are glad to see from a letter of Mr. Caie, in the Home and Foreign Record of our Church, that there is a prospect of a new church in our connection, in St. John. The original fund of \$9.000 has been increased throu h Mr. Cale's exertions to \$15 000. With such a fund subscribed, there is no .oom for doubt as to the success of the un-The old and new school Presbydertaking. terians of the States, after having been sepaated for thirty years, have declared in favor of re union.
